
Observations for this Industry

Many practical energy efficiency measures can be put in place and pay for themselves in just a couple years or less to help nonprofit groups keep costs low and contribute to a greener environment. Taking steps to better manage energy use is a strategic way to control costs and keep valued funds directed toward the nonprofit's mission and programs.

Energy Efficiency Solutions for this Industry

- Improve the quality of lighting and reduce energy consumption by retrofitting parking areas for staff and members with LED fixtures.
- Improve the quality of light and reduce energy usage by retrofitting existing lighting with advanced fluorescent fixtures.
- Save energy and reduce maintenance costs by replacing old inefficient exit signs with LED models.
- Install occupancy sensors to reduce lighting-related consumption.
- Install smart power strips to eliminate phantom loads from computers and office equipment and reduce the facility's plug load energy use.
- Replace kitchen and refrigeration equipment, such as ice machines and reach-in refrigerators and freezers, with energy-efficient models to reduce consumption.
- Participate in FirstEnergy's Building Operations Training Tuition Reimbursement Program to increase knowledge of efficient building operations.
